Course outline

Year 7

Students complete 3 lessons each of ACE English and Humanities based on the Australian Curriculum alongside their other core subjects. Enrichment opportunities including extension projects to occur throughout the year. Variety of incursions and excursions including a local Fraser Coast excursion.

Year 8

Students complete 3 lessons each of ACE English and Humanities based on the Australian Curriculum alongside their other core subjects. Enrichment opportunities including extension projects to occur throughout the year. Variety of incursions and excursions including a regional excursion to the Sunshine Coast.

Year 9

Students complete 3 lessons each of ACE English and Humanities based on the Australian Curriculum alongside their other core subjects. Enrichment opportunities including extension projects to occur throughout the year. Variety of incursions and excursions including a metropolitan excursion to Brisbane.

Year 10

Students complete 3 lessons of English Literature and 3 lessons of History based on the Australian Curriculum alongside their core subjects. Enrichment opportunities include connections to local universities and industries as well as linking to challenging extension learning projects. Variety of incursions and excursions including a possible interstate excursion to highlight the skills learnt over their time in the ACE program.

Students complete English Literature and a Humanities subject of their choice (Business, Accounting, Modern History, Ancient History, Geography).
