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What experiences do I need before enrolling?

Enrolment in Year 10 Pre-Senior Early Childhood is a compulsory requirement to being enrolled in the Cert III Early Childhood Education and Care qualification in Year 11 and 12.

Description/Outline:

Cairns Training Academy, RTO # 30857 is considered the RTO in regards to assessing and issuing Qualifications and Statements of Attainment.

Packaging Rules:

Students are required to demonstrate competency in 18 units. 15 core units plus three (3) elective units must be completed to achieve the full qualification.

Assessment: This is a competency-based course. Students will have multiple opportunities to demonstrate they can competently complete set activities over the course of study. Students will be assessed using a variety of techniques such as: observation, questioning, and development of a skills portfolio.

Late enrolments in Certificate courses: Students enrolling later than the start of the course or changing subjects during the course may not achieve sufficient competencies to be eligible for a certificate, however, they may receive a statement of attainment. In these cases, students may receive partial credit towards their QCE.

Fees: The cost to complete the course at USHS is \$1100, payable over the two year period. This includes all learning materials, a uniform (shirt and hat) for practical placement, a Senior First Aid certificate and an excursion for enrichment outcomes. It is mandatory that students have a laptop as all learning material provided by the private provider is online. .

Course Materials: It is mandatory that students have a laptop, as all learning material provided by Cairns Training Academy is online. It is also recommended students purchase a suitably sized USB or external hard drive to save work and resources where required.

Homework: All homework will be related to the work undertaken in class and will support the assessment tasks. Students are expected to review and reflect on work regularly. Access to the internet and OneDrive will also be an advantage for additional materials such as audio, videos, tasks sheets and revision resources.
