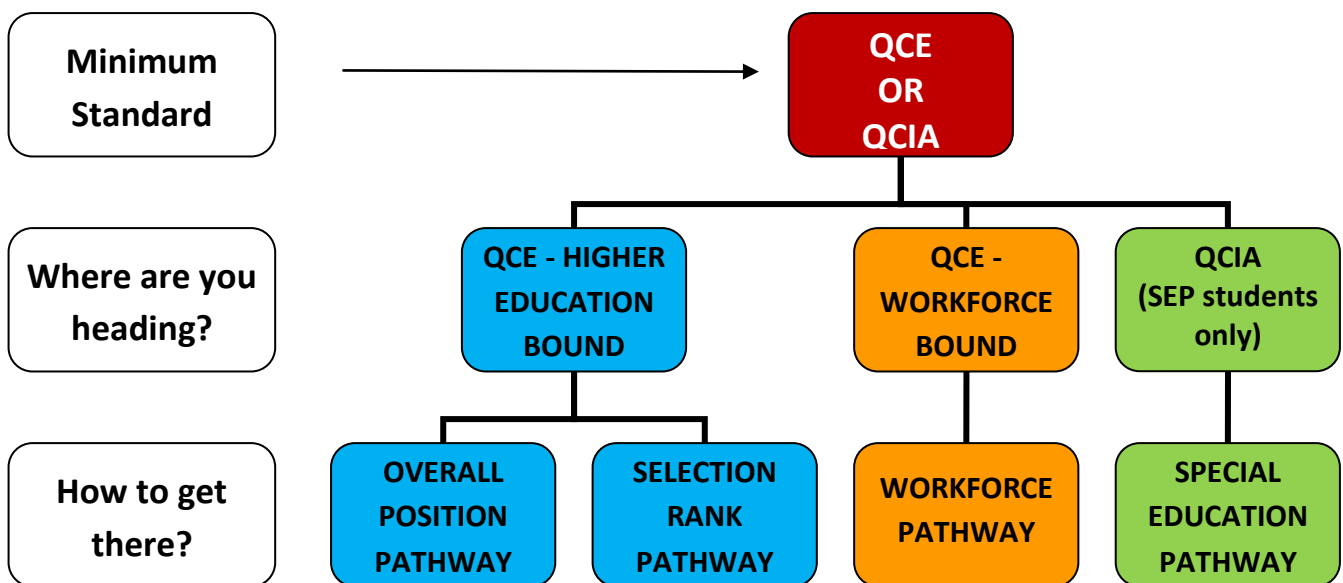

Some Guidelines for Subject Selection

All Students must select:

- ❖ 6 subjects
- ❖ an English Subject
- ❖ at least one Mathematics Subject
- ❖ subjects that align with one of the pathways mentioned below
- ❖ Workforce students can only choose to study the following Higher Education Subjects:
 - English (instead of English Communication)
 - Maths A (instead of/as well as Prevocational Maths)
 - Chinese
 - Music
- ❖ Some subjects can't be studied together, hence if a Higher Education and Workforce version of a subject exist (eg: Graphics and Industrial Graphics Skills) **students cannot select both** unless prior approval from the Head of Year has been granted.

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Urangan Tech Program (2016 TBC for 2017)

Urangan Tech (U-TECH) is a vocational pathway partnership between Urangan State High School and East Coast TAFE which presents some great opportunities for those students who know what they want to study and are focused on their career goals.

The U-Tech program allows students to study their chosen vocational field, obtain structured work placement in their field of study, as well as achieve their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) at the end of year 12.

The management and organisation of the program is shared jointly between Urangan State High School and East Coast TAFE. All students are enrolled through Urangan State High School and have access to services and extra-curricular activities provided by the school.

Students study English, Maths and three other subjects taught by Urangan State High School teachers at the Urangan State High School campus in Robert Street four days per week.

Students also study a trade certificate through **East Coast TAFE (who are the RTO for these certificates)** one day per week on the East Coast TAFE campus in Urraween Road.

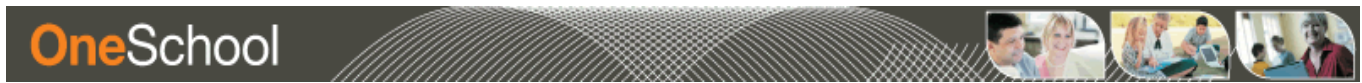

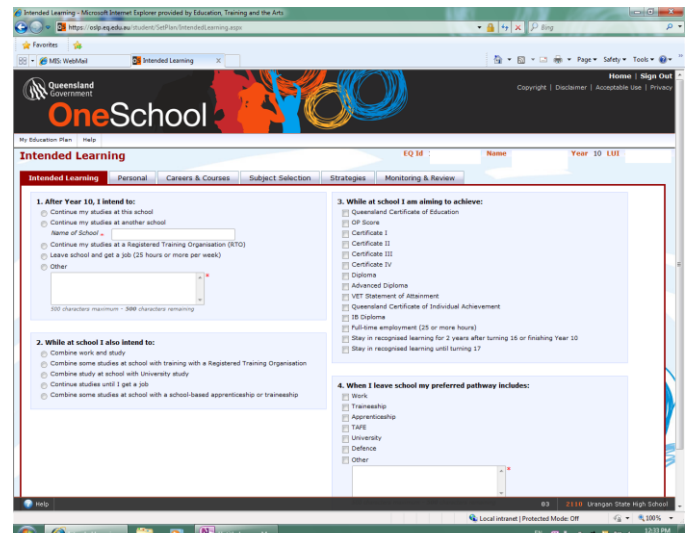
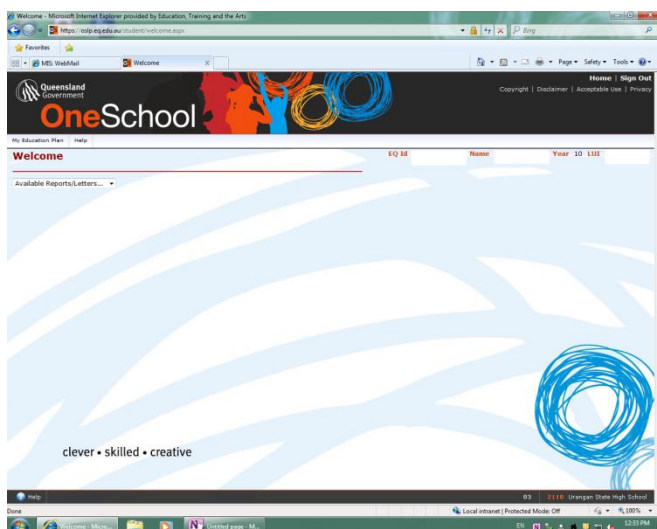
Parent Information for One School SET Plans

Students at school have been completing their SET Plan on OneSchool.

Please check at home that all aspects of the SET Plan have been entered before your ECP/SET Plan meeting in early May.

The following are a list of steps that will be completed before the SET Plan meeting:

1. Students log into One School using a browser with the address <https://oslp.eq.edu.au>
2. Select My Education Plan from the One School Web Site (Click Top Left).
3. Review Intended Learning Tab, enter data and remember to save.
4. Click on the Personal Tab and add data for Goals, Areas to improve, Interests and Strengths.
5. Click Careers and Courses Tab and use links to the Job guide and QTAC web site for a source of data and ideas. Complete the Careers and Courses sections. Please note that these searches may be a little difficult to use. List subject prerequisites contained in the courses link on the QTAC web site.
6. Current part time jobs or School Apprenticeship/Traineeship should also be entered.
7. Review Academic results from the learning snapshot section.
8. Click on the subject selection Tab. Students should have picked Six subjects from either the Higher Education or Workforce pathways and have the selections on their sheet.
9. Take careful note of the instructions in the subject selection section.
10. Students currently failing English and/or Mathematics must select the workforce pathway.
11. Enter you subjects by clicking on them,
12. Edit Intended Learning Tab if required.
13. Click Strategies Tab and add in strategies to improve.
14. Your SET Plan has been entered. Please adjust as often as you need until you get your QCE. Data entered will be reviewed at the SET Plan meeting.
