Qualification Description

The Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation involves students learning in, about and through outdoor physical and recreational activities. Learning experiences in this area are designed to allow students to develop as increasingly self-directed, interdependent/independent lifelong learners.

Outdoor recreation includes any learning experience in which the outdoor environment takes a direct and indispensable role in the learning process. It provides the opportunity for students to participate in activities that enhance the growth of personal and social skills, promote the development of environmental awareness and enable the acquisition of skills related to outdoor recreation.

Entry Requirements

Successful completion of Pre-Senior Certificate in Outdoor Recreation in Semester 2 Year 10.

All students who enrol in a vocational qualification must provide a Unique Student Identifier (USI) number to school management. This can be done through the class teacher to the RTO Manager. Certificates and Statements of Attainment will not be issued to the student if they do not provide a USI number.

The number of classes in this subject will be limited to one (1) for each year level, 11 and 12. Furthermore, student numbers in these classes will be limited to a maximum of 25 places. Entry conditions apply. Students will be eligible for selection if they meet set criteria in Year 10 Pre-Senior Outdoor Recreation. These criteria include; overall suitability, participation, behaviour, attendance and assessment submission.

Duration and Location

This is a two-year course delivered in Years 11 and 12 on site at Urangan State High School.

Training and assessing will take place over 3 x 70min lessons per week over two years.

Additional hours outside of school time will also be required i.e. days trips / camps

QLD College of Wine and Tourism will issue a Statement of Attainment upon successful completion of this unit. This will be recorded as a credit transfer on the student's record.

Urangan State High School will issue the Qualification for students deemed competent in all 15 units of competency or a Statement of Attainment if students have achieved competency in less than the required 15 units of competency.

Delivery Modes

A range of delivery modes will be used during the teaching and learning of this qualification.

These include:

Guided learning

Assessment

Assessment is competency based and completed in a simulated outdoor recreation environments. Units of competency are clustered and assessed in this way to replicate as close as possible what occurs in an outdoor recreation work environment.

Assessment techniques include:

Observations

Folios of work

Questioning

Projects

Written and practical tasks

RTO Obligation

The RTO guarantees that the student will be provided with every opportunity to complete the qualification. We do not guarantee employment upon completion of this qualification.

Students who are deemed competent in all 15 units of competency will be awarded a Qualification and a record of results.

Students who achieve at least one unit of competency (but not the full qualification) will receive a Statement of Attainment.

Late enrolments in Certificate courses

Students enrolling later than the start of the course or changing subjects during the course may not achieve sufficient competencies to be eligible for a certificate; however they may receive a statement of attainment. In these cases students may receive partial credit towards their QCE.

Fees

It is estimated that students will need to pay \$270 before starting the course in Year 11 and a further \$300 before continuing the course in Year 12, making the total course cost \$570 over the two years. If you choose this subject you will be provided with a letter outlining all the details of costs and payment options available to you.

Please Note: Students will also be required to purchase their own food for some camps in addition to the cost of the course.

Pathways

On successful completion of this course, students will attain competencies that will prepare them for the outdoor recreation and tourism industry. Within this industry they may specialise in particular activity sectors or undertake general employment or further training in the industry.

Some possible careers/industries that this course can lead to include, outdoor education, sport and recreation, environmental studies, ecotourism, recreation and environmental management, photographer, Journalist, Outdoor Adventure Guide, Primary teaching, Park Rangers, Environmental Health Professional and Physical education teaching. Students are also able to further their study at a higher level in the many strands of the Sports, Fitness and Recreation Training package (SIS10).

If the full requirements of a certificate are not met, students will be awarded Statements of Attainment in those units of competency, which they have achieved.

Working with Children / Blue Card requirement

Volunteers and trainee students are required a blue card if their work or practical placement in sport and active recreation includes, or is likely to include, providing services that are directed mainly towards children, or conducting activities that mainly involve children, unless an exemption applies. Exemption categories only apply to qualified teachers, police officers and other varying categories, which do not apply to Urangan State High School.

The class teacher will provide you with a Blue Card application form for you to complete and return to your teacher. Urangan SHS will submit your application on your behalf. Once attained, your Blue Card registration number will be stored and maintained in a Blue Card register for SIS20213 – Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation.
